Safe Walk with Me: The educational activity held in Huamu primary school

An educational activity of Safe Kids Walking Day with the theme "Safe Walk with me" was held successfully on November 24, 2008 in the Huamu Primary School. It was organized by Safe Kids Worldwide, the first and only international non-profit organization dedicated solely to preventing unintentional childhood injury, united with the Huamu Street and FedEx Express which is one of the largest national express companies. It aims to teach kids some safe traffic knowledge and announce to invite the chief coach of Chinese Badminton Team Li Yongbo as the next ambassador of SAFE KIDS Walk. About 260 students of the Huamu Primary School and 20 volunteers of FedEx Express actively participate in the interesting activity. Furthermore, the Chinese Executive Director of Safe Kids Worldwide Cui minyan, the instructor of the 5th traffic police Station in Pudong New Area Gu Xiangmin, the deputy director of the 3rd education bureau Tong Ziqiang, the Chief Recorder of Party Office of the Huamu street and Office Director Li Zhilin, the Office Assistant Director Jiang Weizhong, the Director of the Sanitation Service Centre Wu Chengrong are invited to the activity.

Besides the chief coach Li Yongbo, other four popular Chinese badminton players—Lindan, Xie Zhongbo, Zhangning and Yuyang, who have an excellent performance in the just-ended Chinese Badminton Open in 2008 also attend the public service. They as well as the volunteers issue the proposal to the community and personally set an example, hoping road traffic security can get further improved to make sure that around the community and the school environment can even more safeguard child's walk safety.

SA Unions is the peak Union body in South Australia. South Australia is on the cusp of economic and social change.

The SA Unions Agenda for South Australia was launched on 25 November 2008 and contains key goals, recommendations and initiatives. The agenda is set out as a 4-part manifesto of priorities to achieve SA Unions' vision for a just South Australia with safe and fair working conditions and a strong sustainable economy that supports families, communities and the environment for the future.

Two of the recommendations under "A strong safety regime" include South Australia becoming an international Safe Community and the *Passport to Safety* program (developed by Safe Communities Canada and now adapted by the national Safe Communities Foundations in Australia and New Zealand) becoming the standard Occupational Health and Safety program for all Year 10 students in South Australia to undertake.
