
News from Youth Park Safe Community, China

Recently, the city of Jinan has gone through sleet days. Additionly, continual cold weather has frozen pipelines split in some residents' houses ,and water dripped from the pipe formed icicle hang from the balcony and wall. Those icicles are very dangerous and it's likely to harm residents.

According to the safe concept of "Put prevention first" the Youth park community publicized the danger from icicles in the administrative region, reminding them to avoid walking under the icicles and improve safe consciousness. In order to solve the problem at the bottom, the community workers examined the possibilities of danger from icicles carefully and thoroughly, and cleared them away. On, Feb 1st, 2008, the Youth Park Community arranged professional workers to clear all the icicles of the NO.6 building of Wulipaifang community of the administrative region. Seeing all the icicles were removed, Wu Shengkun, one resident of the area, said: "Icicles are gone, and our anxious about the danger is also gone. It is the community workers make our living environment much safer!"

Accreditation means greater safety for KIDS

Primary school pupils across Australia will learn and play in safer environments with the official endorsement of the KIDS Foundation as Australia's first National Safe School Affiliate Agency at a ceremony in Melbourne, Australia, 26th February.

With injuries leading the cause of death for children aged between zero and 14 years, the Safe School Community International Accreditation Program (SSCIAP) is instrumental in reducing these figures in school communities.

As the national leader in childhood injury prevention, the Ballarat-based KIDS Foundation provides resources to more than 7000 primary schools and delivers quality school and community based safety education programs to more than 300 primary schools each year.

"We are pleased and proud that our commitment to childhood safety and accident prevention has resulted in such prestigious accreditation," KIDS Foundation founder Susie O'Neill said during the signing at ArtPlay, Birrarung Marr (next to Federation Square), Melbourne.

"We are committed to developing inclusive, cooperative and strong Safe School Community Networks across Australia to further improve the educational experiences of young people by ensuring they operate in a safe environment."

With the official signing of the document, KIDS Foundation becomes Australia's only Safe School Affiliate Agency and thus takes on the responsibility of supporting schools in their bid to achieve Safe School Community status. To gain accreditation these schools and their communities must be committed to continually striving to build safer surroundings and to developing a culture of appropriate risk management for young people.

Ms O'Neill said schools seeking accreditation would have to meet strict criteria and show they had a long term commitment to improving child safety.

"Once accredited they will be recognised internationally as a Safe School," Ms O'Neill said. This could lead to major benefits when promoting the school to prospective parents and when seeking additional funding.

Joining KIDS Foundation for this auspicious occasion were members of the legendary Oarsome Foursome (Australia's best known rowing team), Government and Safe Community leaders, students from KIDS Foundation Safety Club schools and New Zealand-based SSCIAP Accrediting Centre's Chair Dr Carolyn Coggan.
